

Millboard® Decking

Care and Storage

Cleaning

Millboards are manufactured with an anti-algae material, therefore, resist both algae and moss growth.

DO NOT use any kind of chemical, abrasive cleaners, solvents, wax, oil or indeed any other cleaners on Millboards as these can harm the deckboard finish.

DO NOT pressure wash as you could damage the finish on the boards.

The surface texture is virtually non-porous, to remove dirt and grime wash with soapy water and brush with a broom before rinsing off. Ensure that the spacing between each board is clear to allow for good water drainage.

Damage to Surface

Mild damage should not show under normal usage conditions due to the varied texture and colours in the Millboards, however, sharp metal objects such as narrow metal chair legs, spiked shoes or similar may damage the surface. Use of rock salt or grit may increase surface wear on decks as it is abrasive.

Weathering

Long term ageing tests have shown that Millboard decking is very stable and no adverse reactions are expected over time under normal conditions.

All colours have been carefully selected and hand finished ensuring Millboard Decking will give an excellent overall natural effect throughout its life, certainly holding colour longer than wooden decking and many other composites.

Storage and Handling

Millboard should always be stored on a flat surface or level bearers every 400mm and stored in a well ventilated area.

Normal health and safety precautions should be observed at all times when handling millboard products.

DO NOT burn any waste or off cuts, dispose as refuse.

Pallets of Millboards should only be lifted when the boards are secured to the pallet.

Winter Ice and Snow

Granulated table salt can be used to keep your deck ice-free, stainless steel screws are available and should be used where the use of salt used on a regular basis.

Do not use rock salt, as it can be very abrasive. A 'spring clean' of soap and water with a soft broom or mop is recommended when winter is over.

Colour Variations

As with all flooring it is best to purchase all you need in one go as batches made months apart may vary slightly. These variations are considered acceptable, similar to natural timber.

Do not install boards if colours are unacceptable or if for any reason you believe them to be defective.
